



Eastside Village Grand Opening, air show set

LAKE CITY— Eastside Village has set Sept. 28 and 29 and Oct. 5 and 6 for its Grand Opening.

Kermit Horne, owner, said the official opening of his new mobile home community was selected to coincide with the annual Lake City air show that will be held the weekend of Sept. 28 and 29.

The Grand Opening will be held on both weekends on Saturdays from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. and on Sundays from 1 to 5 p.m.

Horne said the Grand Opening will include eight furnished homes that were built by Fleetwood, Homes of Merit and Guerdon. The homes have been landscaped and in every way have been attractively decorated in order to show prospective home buyers what they can expect.

Horne said he is offering a \$500 discount off the price of the new homes during the Grand Opening. Lot rent includes cable television service, sewer, trash pickup and water.

Eastside Village includes tennis courts and a nature trail with picnic tables. A swimming pool will be constructed.

Eastside Village will have 99 homes when fully developed. It is located just east of Lake

City off Highway 100.

The sixth annual air show will be at the Lake City Municipal Airport on U.S. 90 immediately east of Lake City on Sept. 28 and 29. According to Judge Vernon Douglas, approximately 100 pilots will fly in for the weekend event—and approximately 20,000 spectators will enjoy the air show.

The show will include aircraft from the Air Force, Navy, Marines and Coast Guard, plus commercial aircraft and world-class air show pilots who will thrill the audiences with their daring.

The Valiant Air Command will open both shows with World War II American and Japanese fighter planes and a reenactment of the attack on Pearl Harbor.

Also included will be a midway of rides for youngsters and rides in some of the aircraft. Numerous commercial and military aircraft will be on display both days of the show and showgoers will be able to hop into the aircraft to get a feel of what it is like to fly them.

The show is completely handled by volunteers, including food concessions and beverage stands. All proceeds from the show go to charity.
